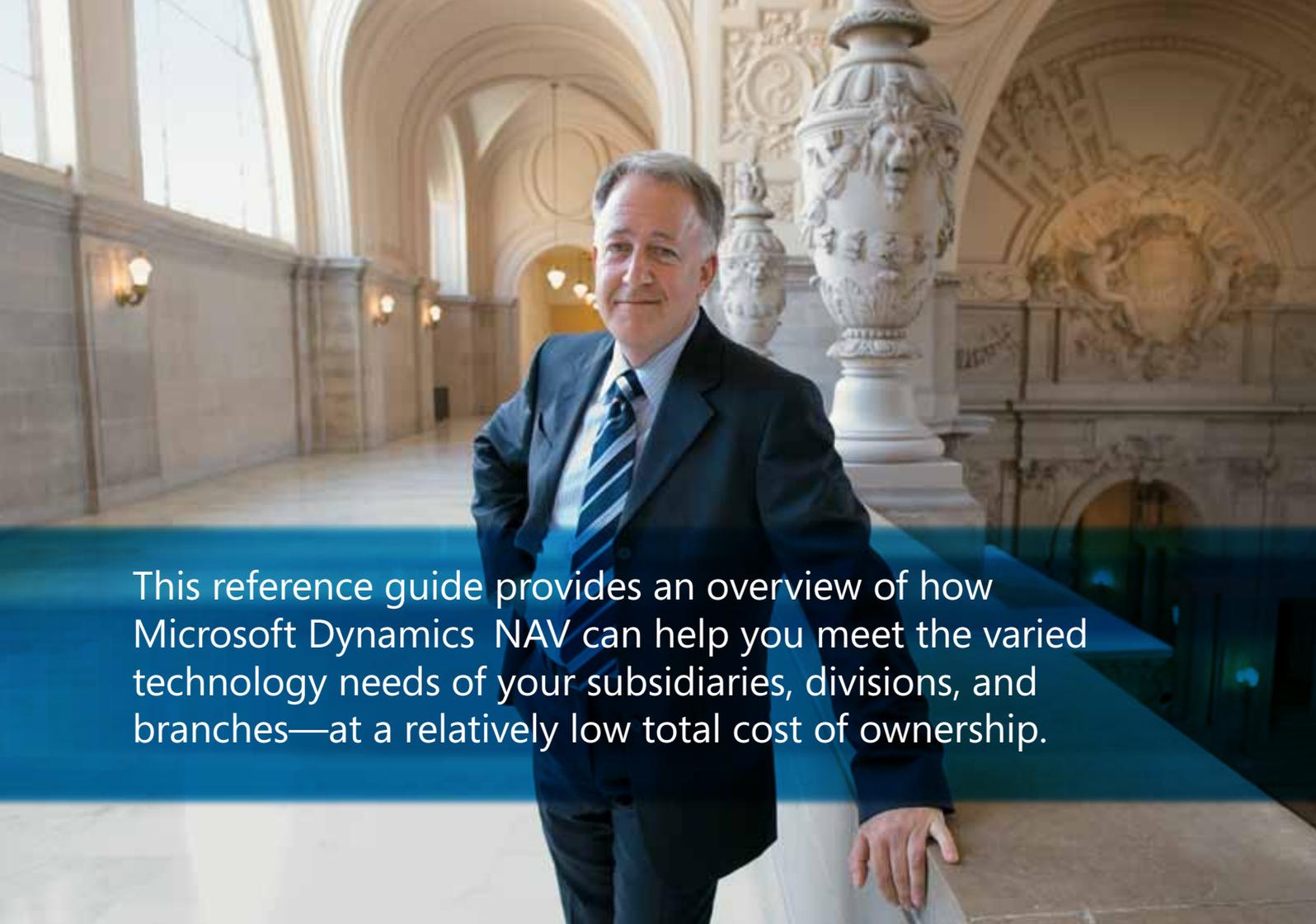

2. Improve workflow efficiency for financial consolidation

- Consolidate financial statements for a series of sites from a single database, other Microsoft Dynamics NAV databases, or other programs.

- For greater or more complex needs, use an electronic data exchange solution based on BizTalk Server and Commerce Gateway in Microsoft Dynamics NAV in combination with the XMLports.

5. Reduce costs by enabling you to share responsibility for services

- Map between the different systems of the parent company and the sites, taking into account any difference in currencies.
- If you work on a closed network (such as a virtual private network, or VPN), use Intercompany Postings in Microsoft Dynamics NAV to help you create all the necessary documents (including sales and purchase documents and

- general ledger entries) for the entire workflow, for more than one company at a time.
- Encourage sites to adopt processes by enabling them to work in the same, familiar Microsoft Dynamics NAV interface.

6. Promote a more efficient supply chain

- Treat interdivisional transactions as normal sales and purchase transactions.
- Eliminate duplicate data entry.
- Avoid the cost of sending, receiving, and printing documents.

7. Respond proactively to business conditions

- Set up alerts in Microsoft Dynamics NAV that will automatically generate e-mail messages to inform you of critical business conditions at your sites or supply chain partners.
- Use templates included with Business Notification in Microsoft Dynamics NAV.
- Set up your own alerts based on the way you like to run your business.

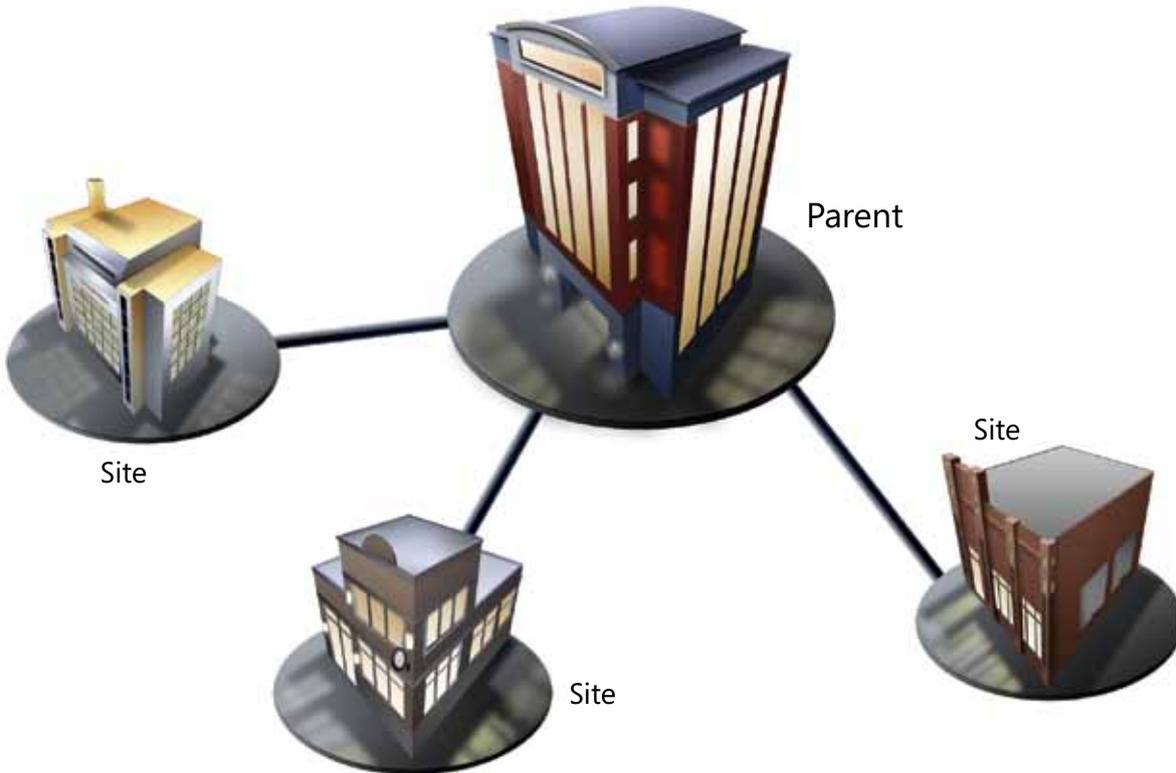
